THE CASE AGAINST SUSAN COLLINS

REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS

- NARAL Pro-Choice America gave Collins' legislative record a disturbingly low score of 20% in 2018.¹
- Collins co-sponsored a bill to allow employers to use religious objections to deny contraceptive coverage for employees.²
- Collins has confirmed dozens of anti-choice judicial nominees, some of whom have since upheld state laws that restrict abortion access and defund Planned Parenthood.³
- As a direct result of Collins' confirmation of Brett Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court, 7 states issued bans on abortions, some at conception and with no exceptions for rape or incest.⁴
- Collins confirmed HHS Secretary Alex Azar, who then led the effort to eliminate contraceptive and preventive care for millions of women by instituting a rules change to Title X family planning funds.⁵
- Collins also confirmed Trump's first HHS Secretary Tom Price, who helped formulate new rules to allow employers to deny contraceptive care coverage to employees if they have religious objections.⁶
