## THE CASE AGAINST SUSAN COLLINS

## TAX BILL

- Against widespread opposition from voters and economists, Collins and Republicans passed a \$1.7 trillion tax bill in December 2017.<sup>1</sup>
- The bill will raise taxes on 53% of Americans in 2027.<sup>2</sup>
- The Congressional Budget Office estimates the tax cut will add \$1.9 trillion to deficits over 10 years.<sup>3</sup>
- The bill reduced the amount Americans can deduct for medical expenses.<sup>4</sup>
- A texas judge who overturned the ACA cited the tax bill's elimination of the individual mandate in his decision.<sup>5</sup>
- Last year, for the first time in history, the 400 richest Americans paid a lower tax rate than any other income group.<sup>6</sup>
